Introduction

The Master of Research is designed to provide graduates with an advanced and integrated body of knowledge in their field of expertise. Graduates will be equipped with systematic and advanced knowledge and skills in research methods, critical thinking, communication, and creative problem solving in complex business settings. Through independent research students identify, investigate, and address a complex challenge in their area of business management, organisation management, or farm management and agribusiness. Students will present their findings, demonstrating an original contribution to the business sector.

Graduates of the Master of Research may find employment in executive leadership and senior management roles in a relevant occupational field, such as business and industry, entrepreneurial start-ups, not-for-profit organisations, public sector departments, and educational institutions that require skills in research and critical thinking.

Core Research Component

RS710	Masters Research
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The course structure is based on four semesters (each semester is 12 teaching weeks, plus one review week and one study week).

- 4 x core research units (40 credit points)
- 1 x 30,000-word Masters Thesis (120 credit points)

To qualify for the award of Master of Research a candidate shall accrue an aggregate of at least 160 credit points, including satisfactory completion of the core units.

International Students

International students who have not completed an Australian qualification must have appropriate educational qualifications, deemed equivalent under the NOOSR guidelines. International students whose entry qualifications were obtained in an institution where English is not the language of instruction normally require an International English Language Testing Services (IELTS) of 6.5, with a score of not less than 6.0 in any of the four skill areas, or equivalent. It is expected that students can demonstrate that the English language test was successfully completed within two years of the date of application for admission.

Note: International students must hold a valid student visa. There are numerous conditions that apply to a student visa. A holder of a student visa may not work, paid or unpaid, for more than 40 hours in any fortnight during semester.
